Day One, 7th November – REGIONAL POLICY AND STRATEGY

The first day is a **Regional Assembly consultation event** held in conjunction with TV Energy, examining the Regional Strategy for Energy Efficiency and Renewable Energy – document out for public consultation in October 2002. Additional, targeted workshop activity to be held.

FORMAT: plenary presentations followed by workshop groups in the morning and afternoon. Invited expert speakers from home and abroad will introduce key aspects of the workshops. Accompanying exhibition of suppliers/ equipment. Posters invited from existing and prospective projects illustrating local/ regional action.

Recommended targets for the Thames Valley and Surrey are 128MW of renewables by 2010 (up to 75MW from biomass) and 196MW by 2016 (up to 125MW from biomass).

Day Two, 8th November – LOCAL PROJECTS AND ACTIONS

TV Energy stakeholder report (following up from TVE2001) and strategy for the Thames Valley/ Western Policy Area (Bucks, Berks, Oxon and Surrey) of the SE illustrated by presentations from local, regional and international partners.

FORMAT: plenary presentations all day with networking time over lunch. Accompanying exhibition of suppliers/ equipment. Posters from existing and prospective projects illustrating local/ regional action.
